Headteacher's Foreword

As I sit down to write this, our Year 10 boys have just returned from a week of work experience across various host employers, and I hope they've come away with a real sense of what it means to carry themselves as young Muslim professionals in the workplace. Just the week before, the very same cohort had returned from their Snowdon climb, raising £22,791.97 for Gaza against a £20,000 target, mashaAllah tabarakAllah. What a way to end the year for our Year 10s, on the mountain and then straight into the world of work.

Alhamdulillah, this year's SATs results were among the best we've seen in recent years, a reflection of the hard work of our pupils, the dedication of our staff, and the du'as and support of our parents. A few headlines stood out: **100% of our pupils met the expected standard in Maths against a national average of 74%, and our combined Reading, Writing and Maths score rose to 85% up from 78% last year.** We now turn our attention to Year 11, anticipating their GCSE results with a mixture of excitement and nerves. Please keep them in your du'as over the coming weeks, they have worked hard, and we pray Allah rewards their effort with results that open doors for them.

Looking back over the year, I smile thinking of the fun our pupils had on their end-of-year trips. Chessington and Thorpe Park brought out the excitement in all of them, and our Year 6 pupils had a residential to remember at Gilwell Park, building independence and friendships that I'm sure will stay with them for years to come.

The Year 11 Graduation itself was a truly special occasion. Families, staff and students came together to celebrate the success of our beloved Year 11 boys, and it was moving to see how far they've come. We pray Allah grants them prosperous futures and that they go on to contribute meaningfully to the Muslim ummah. At

the time of writing this article, I look forward to the Year 6 celebration assembly.

We wish our Year 6 girls every success and prosperity in their future endeavours, please stay close to the mosque and to your school, you will always be part of our family here. Some of our Year 6 boys will be joining us at LEA in September, and we cannot wait to welcome you through our doors. To those moving on elsewhere, we wish you all the best and hope you'll always feel welcome to come back and visit.

Speaking of September, we cannot wait to welcome our new Year 7 and Year 3 pupils, and to welcome back all of our year groups on Thursday 3rd September. Please look out for a letter with instructions on timings for the first day for all students.

This term we say goodbye to a few members of staff who have given so much to our school community. Ustad Amirul, our Tahfiz teacher, leaves us this summer, he will be greatly missed by staff, students and parents alike, and we thank him for everything he has given to our pupils' Qur'an journeys. 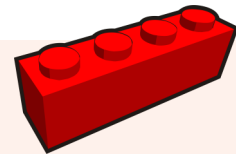
Al Mizan Counsellors Visit Human Aid

What a Wonderful First Year at Al Mizan!

As we reach the end of another academic year, it is hard to believe that it has been a year since our Year 3 pupils first walked through the doors of Al Mizan, yet it feels like only yesterday that they arrived. They arrived as our newest pupils, taking their first step into Key Stage 2 with excitement, curiosity and, for some, a few understandable nerves. Looking back now, it is remarkable just how quickly the year has passed.

Throughout the year, the children have embraced every opportunity that has come their way. They have settled into life at Al Mizan, formed lasting friendships and become valued members of our school community. It has been a pleasure to teach a class that is enthusiastic and full of character. Every child has played their part in making Year 3 such an enjoyable year.

Our learning has taken us to many memorable journeys. In English, the children enjoyed writing in a wide variety of genres, including diaries, newspaper reports, letters, persuasive writing, information texts and traditional tales. They developed their creativity as authors while building the skills and confidence needed to communicate their ideas effectively.

In Maths, the class tackled a broad range of topics, from number and calculation to fractions, measures and problem-solving. It has been wonderful to see their confidence develop as they learnt to explain their thinking and persevere with increasingly challenging questions.

Beyond the core subjects, the children explored fascinating topics across the wider curriculum. They travelled through history, learning about Romans, Anglo-Saxons, Vikings and Ancient Egypt, investigated volcanoes, earthquakes and rainforests in Geography, and discovered the wonders of rocks, forces and magnets in Science. Their creativity flourished through art, design technology and computing, where they produced artwork, designed and made products, and developed their digital skills through programming and animation.

The year also included some memorable experiences beyond the classroom. Our visit to the British Museum brought history to life as the children explored real artefacts linked to their learning, while our LEGO Build the Change workshop at the Idea Store encouraged them to work collaboratively, think creatively and solve real-world problems through imaginative design.

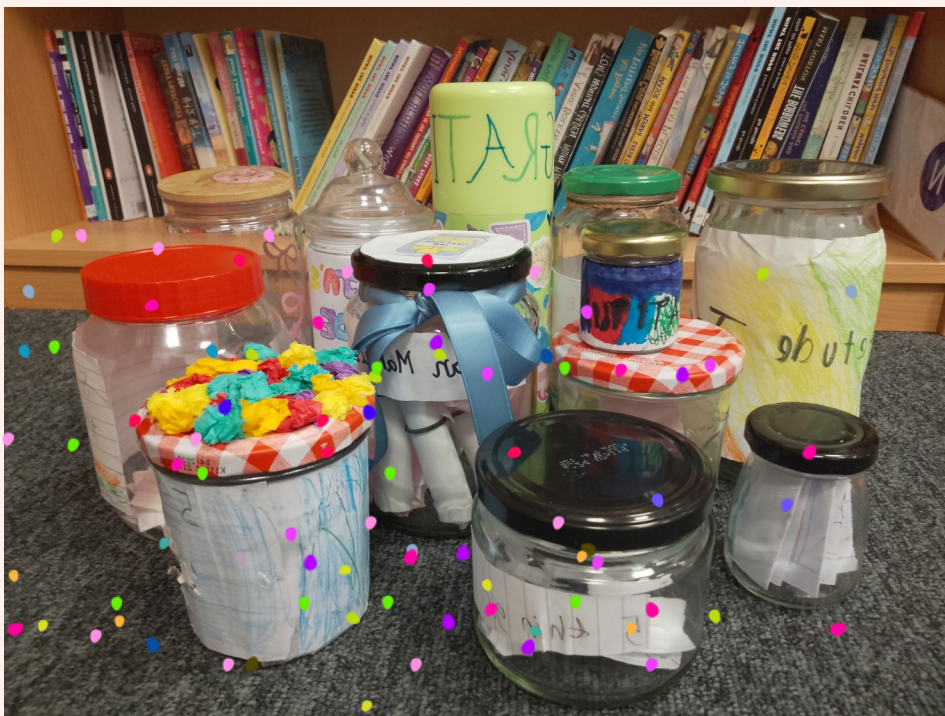

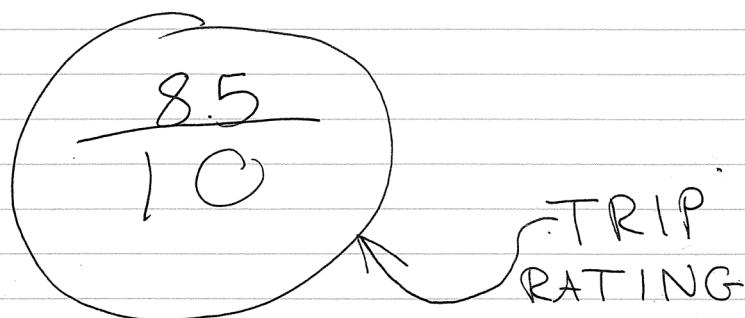


LEA END OF YEAR TRIP TO

Year 10 Mount Snowdon Charity Trek for

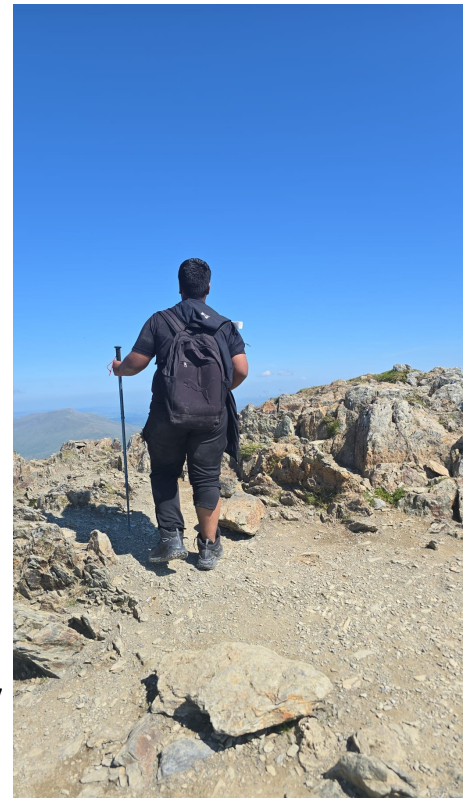


Our Year 10 boys recently completed London East Academy's annual Snowdon Residential Trek, an event that has become a much-loved tradition within our school community.

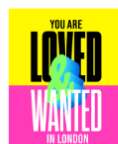
